Get Back To	Let me look into that and I'll get back to you tomorrow.	
Get Back To	Let's get back to the main reason why we called this meeting.	
Hang On	Hang on, someone is texting me from work.	
Hang On	Hang on to that idea, we'll discuss it this afternoon.	
Hang On	You can't hang that on me! We were late because you weren't ready on time.	
Hang On	I don't know how much longer I can hang on! This job is stressing me out.
