<b>Fill In</b>	Please fill in the invoices completely before sending them.	
<b>Fill In</b>	Bob is filling in for John for the week while he's on vacation.

<b>Convinced</b>	I am convinced that aliens exist.	
<b>Pass On</b>	I will pass on the information regarding your absence.	
<b>Pass On</b>	I'm sorry to hear that your aunt has passed on yesterday.	
<b>Pass On</b>	Deaf people pass on their traditions through story telling.	
<b>Work Out</b>	I need to work out the details before I request the time off.	
<b>Care For</b>	Would you care for some water before you go?	
<b>Care For</b>	I need to care for my parents over the weekend.	
<b>Care For</b>	I don't care for jelly beans.	
<b>Care For</b>	Believe it or not, I care for you a lot!	

<b>Put Down</b>	I hate the way she puts down people in meetings.	
<b>Put Down</b>	Put me down for next week; I'm available.	
<b>Settle For</b>	Don't settle for second best.	
<b>Stand For</b>	I will always stand for equal rights.	
<b>Stand For</b>	What does the "B" in FBI stand for?	
<b>Stand For</b>	I'm not going to stand for rude behavior.	
<b>Do With</b>	I suspect she had something to do with it.	
<b>Do With</b>	What does that have to do with it?	
<b>Do With</b>	I could do with a cup of coffee right now!	
<b>Work On</b>	I've been working on my invoices all day.	
<b>Work On</b>	You need to work on your voicing skills.	
<b>Look Up</b>	I need to look up why that store closed down.	
<b>Look Up</b>	I really look up to her for all her hard work with children.	
<b>Make Up</b>	Obviously that story was made up.	
<b>Make Up</b>	The club is made up of former veterans.	
<b>Shut Down</b>	The store shut down after they couldn't make enough profit.
