<b>Off and On</b>	We don't exercise regularly, just off and on.	
<b>And So On</b>	We had cake, ice cream, music, balloons, lemonade, games, and so on.	
<b>On and On</b>	The lecturer went on and on for hours. I finally had to leave.	
<b>Over</b>	She had to do her speech over.	
<b>Over</b>	Over 200 people showed up the the event.	
<b>Go Over</b>	Let's go over your notes before you take the test.	

<b>Run Down</b>	I'm pretty run down from working all day.	
<b>Run Down</b>	That house is really run down. I'm not sure if it's worth fixing.	
<b>Ran Out</b>	We ran out of toner at work.	
<b>Ran Out</b>	The chickens ran out of the barn as soon as they saw the car.	
<b>Secondhand</b>	That's a secondhand blazer but it's still very nice.	
<b>Second</b>	The president proposed the change and I seconded it.	
<b>Settle For</b>	Isabel settled for two computers even though her office needed more.	
<b>Take a breather</b>	After five hours of working on his new computer, Jack finally had to take a breather.	
<b>Take Cover</b>	Take cover! There's bound to be incoming fire!	
<b>Take for a Ride</b>	Whoever sold you that gold coin took you for a ride. It's not gold.	
<b>Word of Mouth</b>	The good news was spread by word of mouth.	
<b>Abide By</b>	John felt that he had to abide by his father's wishes.	
<b>Above</b>	Ron is above Ginney at work, but he treats her like an equal.	
<b>Across the Board</b>	The school board raised the pay of all the teachers across the board.
